

PROTECT YOUR CHILD FROM HAZARDS AT HOME

Do you have young children?

There are many programs in Philadelphia that can help you to make them safe at home

CHIPPING OR PEELING PAINT

- Lead poisoning causes learning problems but is preventable.
- If your home was built before 1978 and the paint looks like this, call the Lead and Healthy Homes Program at 215-685-2788.



RISK FOR FALLS

- Falls are a common way for children to get hurt.
- If you own your home and need repairs, you might be eligible for help. Call the Basic
 Systems Repair Program at 215-448-2160 to learn more.
- If you rent your home and have problems like



broken floors or no railing on stairways, your landlord must fix them. Call 311 to ask for an inspection.

NO SMOKE ALARMS

- Smoke alarms protect your child from fires and smoke.
- If you own your home, call 311 to have a free one installed.
- If you rent, ask your landlord to install smoke alarms. If your landlord doesn't install them, call 311.





- Mold, cockroaches, and mice can make your child's asthma worse.
- If your child has stayed at the hospital for asthma, call the Community Asthma Prevention Program at 215-590-5261 or ask your child's doctor for help getting rid of these asthma triggers.
